Updates on PGR regulations

- Nominal registration
 - Students must apply to transfer to nominal registration, and supervisor must approve the request
 - Students can be in nominal registration for up to six months
 - Students have to pay a fee (around £250)
- Supervisory team
 - Main supervisor, coordinating supervisor, co- or second supervisor.
 - Coordinating supervisor must have supervised PhD student to completion
- Supervisor loading
 - No supervisor loading should exceed 80%
 - Overall supervisor numbers of PGRs should not exceed 6.0 FTE and 10 students in total

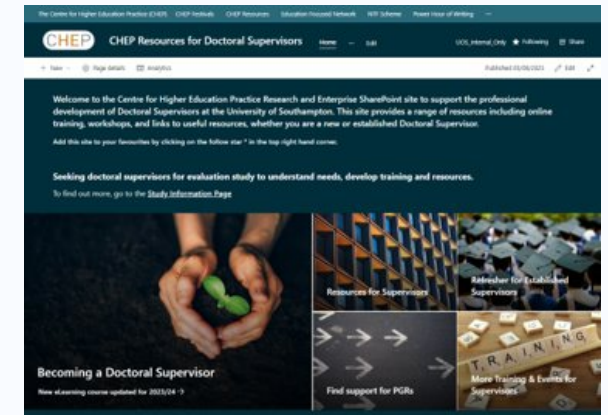

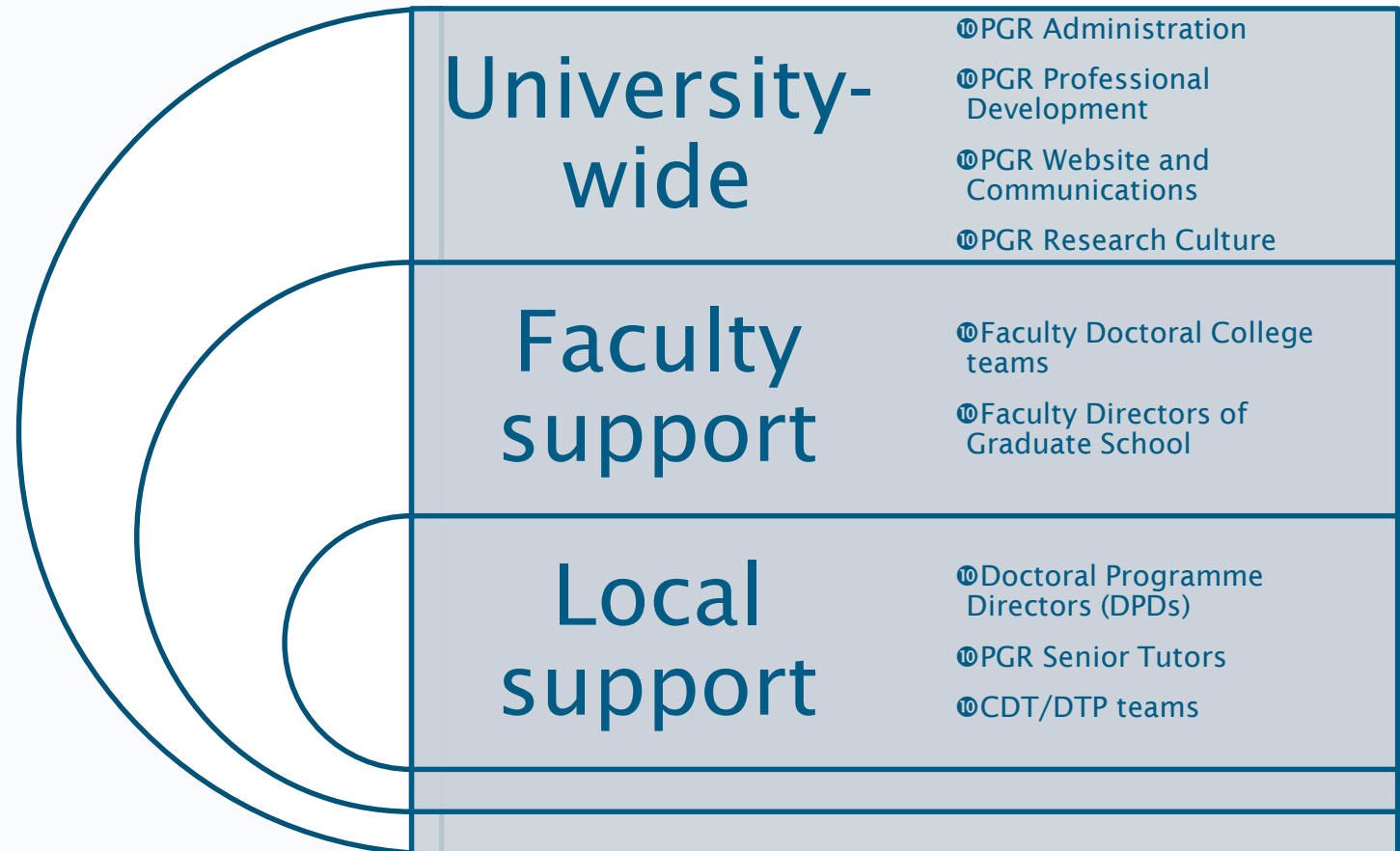

- **Providing Immigration Advice**

Providing immigration advice is regulated by the Office of the Immigration Services Commissioner, and unlawful for anyone to provide unregulated immigration advice or immigration services. Please direct all students needing visa advice to the VISAS Team

- **Graduate Route**

Students eligible to apply for a Graduate Route visa if they have successfully completed the programme of study their visa was issued and still have a Student/Tier 4 visa. The VISAS Team will notify students by email within 10 working days of being awarded.

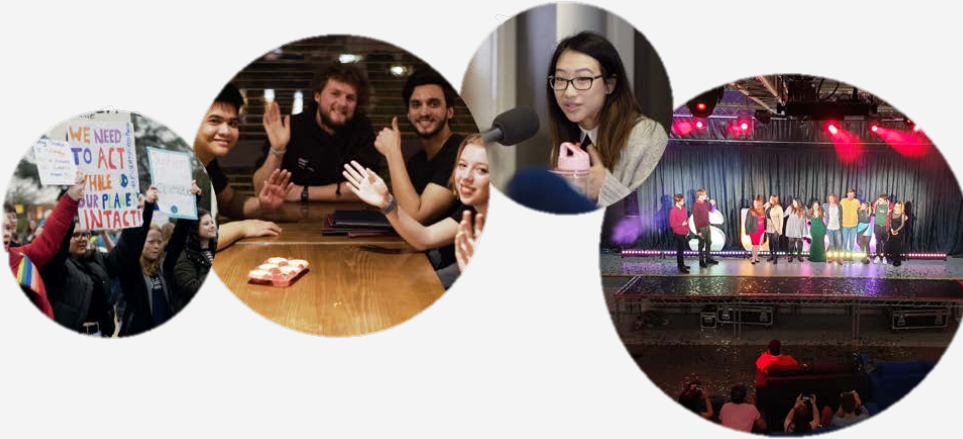
SUSU (Southampton University Students' Union)
